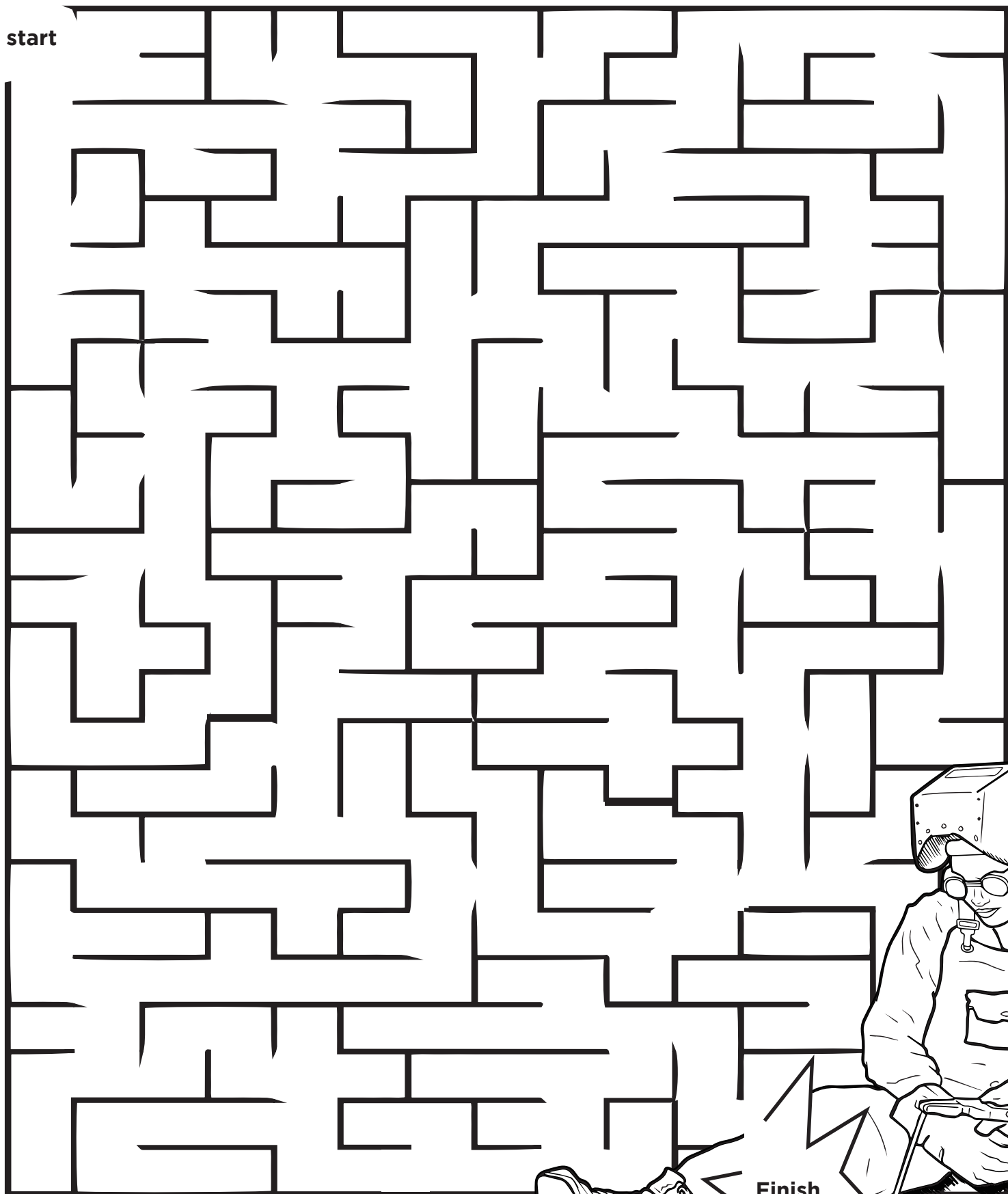

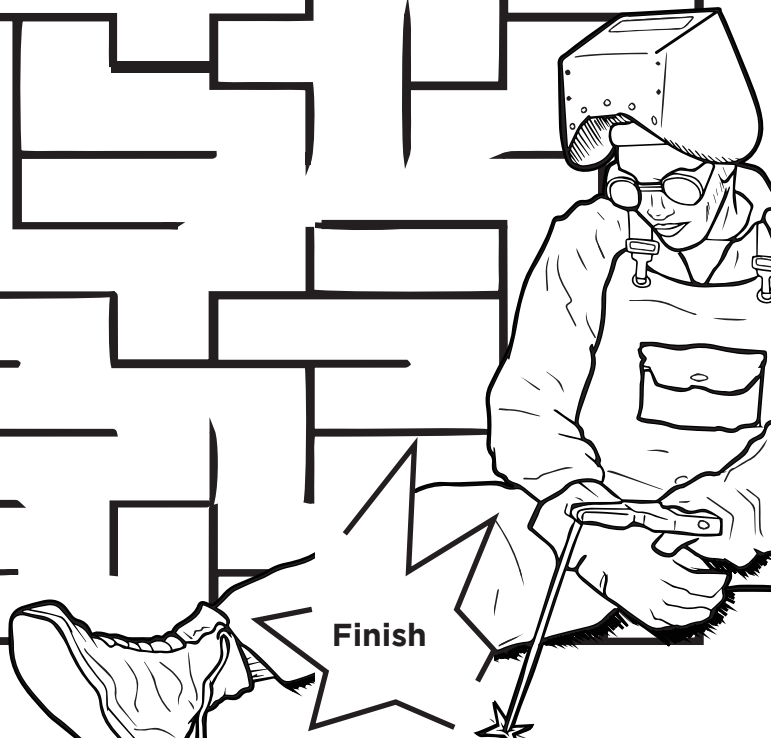

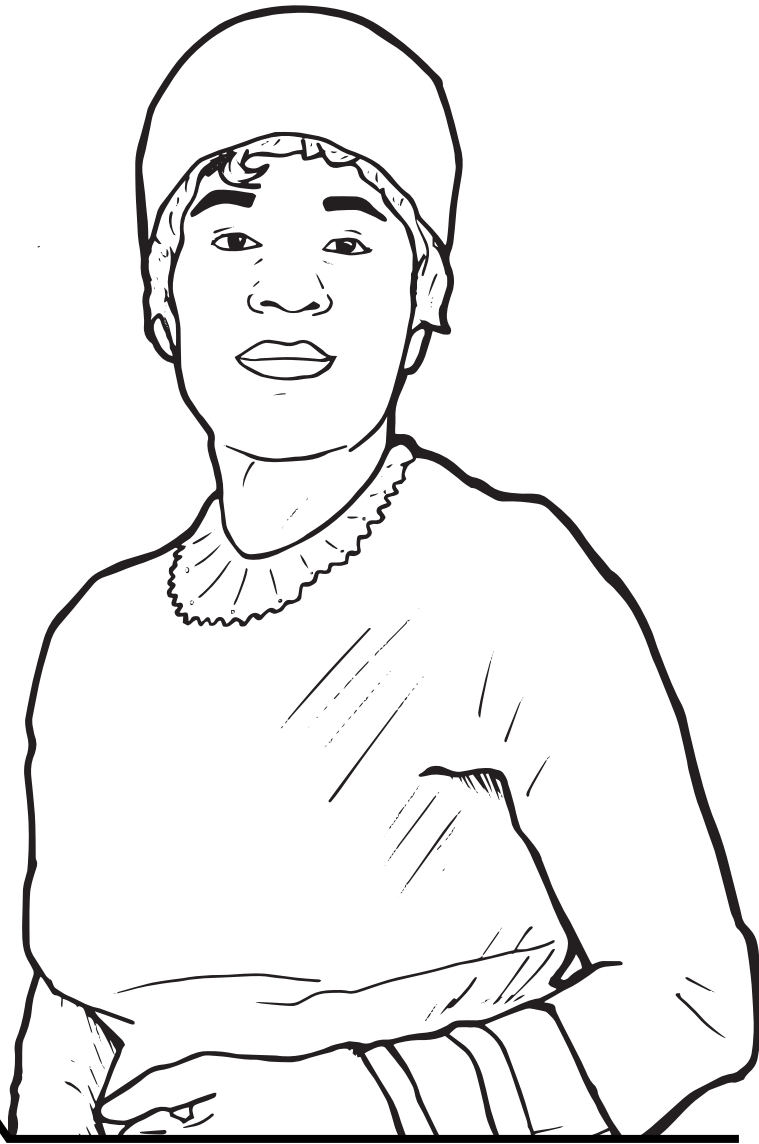
Marinship Legends

Mrs. Annie Small

Born June 20th, 1919

Transitioned July 20, 2018

Ms. Annie Small was a pillar of the Marin City community, and worked as a welder at the Marinshipyard during WW2. Ms. Small has been featured in a book called "Marinship Memories," and received numerous awards for her community and church work in Marin City.



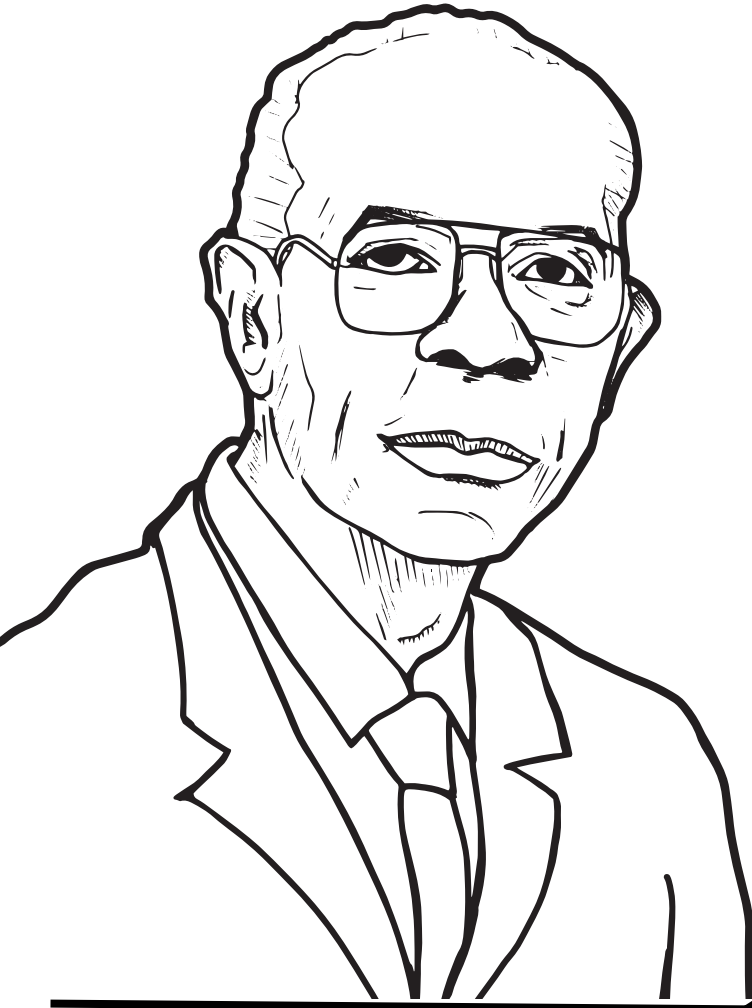
Mr. Joseph James

Born October 8, 1910

Transitioned June 2, 2002

Mr. Joseph James was an actor, singer, welder and civil rights activist. Mr. James was instrumental in changing the discriminatory practices of the union at the Marinship shipyard with the support of Thurgood Marshall and the California Supreme Court.

Marinship Legends



Rev. Leon Samuels

Born May 3rd, 1913

Transitioned February 11th, 1997

Rev. Leon Samuels worked as a welder at the Marinship shipyard during WW2. He ran his own janitorial business after the war, was deeply involved in community building in Marin City, and became an ordained minister in 1987.

Ms. Rodessa Battle

Born March 5th, 1921

Transitioned Aug 6, 2018

Ms. Rodessa Battle was a skilled welder at the Marinship shipyard, and migrated from Louisiana in the 1940's. Ms. Battle is one of the Black "Rosie The Riveters" and went on to become a graduate of the College of Marin.



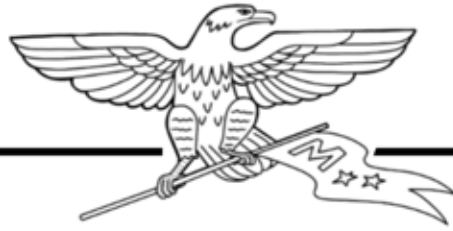

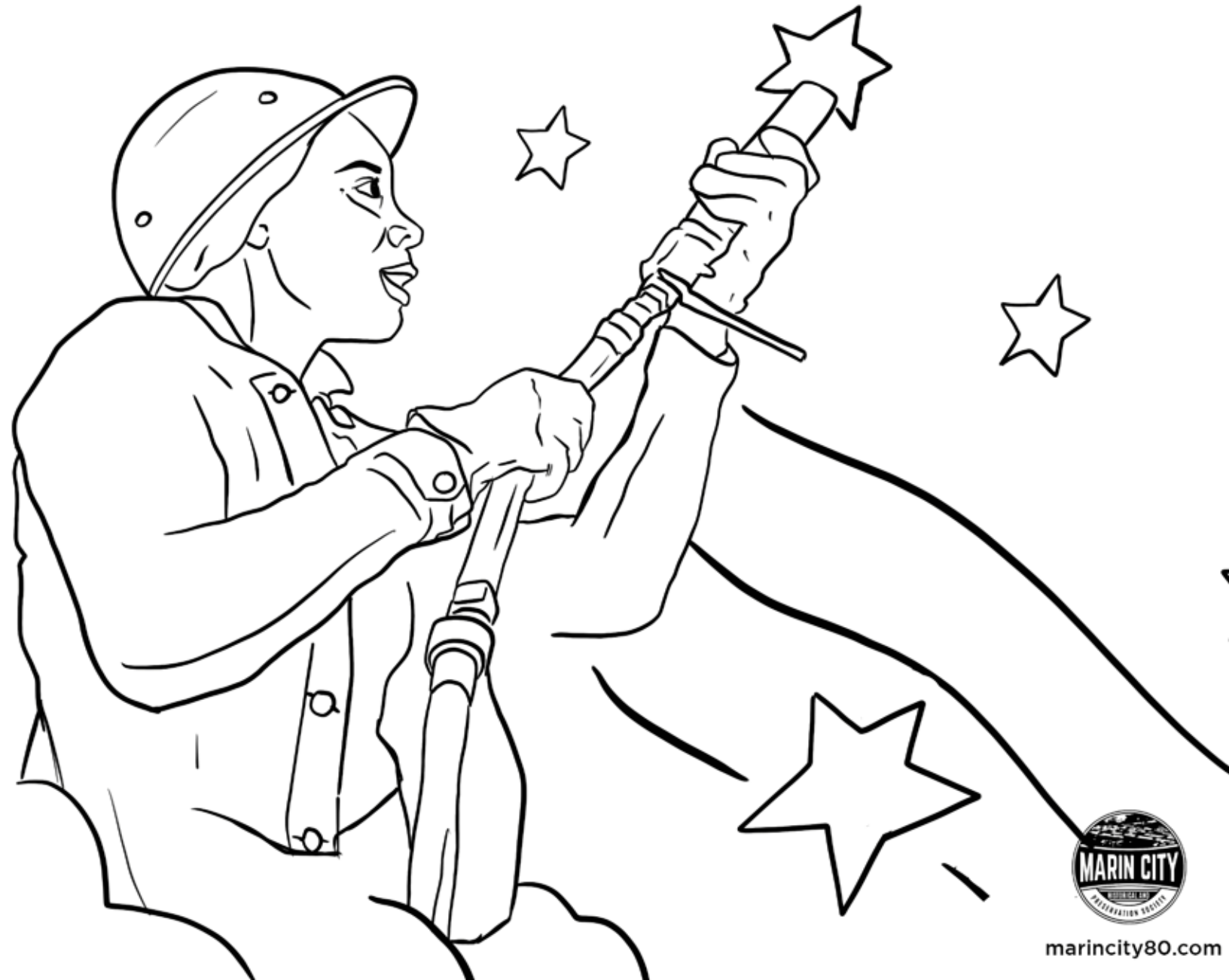

2022 marks the 80th Anniversary of Marin City, California. Beginning with the Marinship shipyard and the need for wartime workers and housing during WW2, many Black families moved from the South to the West looking for a better life. After the war, due to discrimination and laws that prevented Black people from moving to other areas of Marin County, Marin City became home to eight generations of Black families.
